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## GENERAL REASONS FOR THE DECISIONS ON THE ALLOCATION OF RIGHTS AND QUANTUM IN THE WEST COAST ROCK LOBSTER OFFSHORE FISHERY

### 1. Introduction

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After the allocation of medium-term rights in 2001/2002 and the finalisation of the appeals processes in 2002/2003 the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism: Branch Marine and Coastal Management ("*the Department*") commenced with preparations for the allocation of long-term commercial fishing rights.

In January 2004, the Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism ("*the Minister*") announced the commencement of the planning phase. The Minister called on the fishing industry and all other interested and affected parties to submit comment to the Department. A comment box was opened at the Department in which comments could be placed. In order to facilitate communication with the public and fishing communities, the Department developed a dedicated fisheries website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)); it established a customer services centre (0861 123 626) at its Cape Town head office and it further resourced each of the 29 fishery control offices along the coast.

In 2004, the Department also procured the services of project management specialists, specialist legal advisers, IT specialists, and a forensic auditing consortium to advise it on the long-term commercial fishing rights process. A Rights Allocation Unit was established in 2005 to co-ordinate and manage the long-term rights allocation process.

Earlier, during the latter half of 2003, rights were allocated to abalone divers for a period of ten years. In December 2004, another set of "*long-term*" commercial fishing rights were allocated in the large pelagic (tunas and swordfish) fishing industry. Long-term fishing rights for the remaining 20 commercial sectors were scheduled for the last quarter of 2005. The West Coast Rock Lobster Offshore ("*WCRL Offshore*") sector is one of these sectors.

This document is entitled the "*General Reasons for the Decisions on the Allocation of Rights and Quantum in the West Coast Rock Lobster Offshore fishery*" and will be referred to as the "*GPR*". The GPR sets out the criteria and weightings, the process and methodology and the policy reasons for the decisions on

the allocation of rights and quantum in a fishery. Applicants are therefore advised to carefully study the GPR before considering the assessment of their applications and the specific reasons for decisions taken.

Every applicant in this sector will receive the following documentation:

- A notification letter, informing the applicant of the delegated authority's decision, together with the reason for that decision;
- A copy of the GPR;
- Copies of the Score Sheet and Assessment Sheet used to evaluate the applicant's application;
- A copy of the decision-making lists of the delegated authority; and
- An appeal form, which must be submitted together with the appeal (if the applicant chooses to appeal against the decisions on the allocation of a right or the quantum allocated).

The specific reason contained in the notification letter to unsuccessful applicants, together with the GPR, the score sheet and the assessment sheet, constitute the reasons for a decision to refuse an application or grant an application for a right to a specific applicant.

## **2. Policy and Application Form Development for long term rights allocation**

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A detailed report entitled "*Public Participation in the Development of Policy and Application Forms for the Allocation of Long-term Commercial Fishing Rights*" will be made available on the Department's website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)).

A Committee was established to co-ordinate and manage the drafting of a general fisheries policy and sector specific fishing policies. Draft policies were finalised after the Minister held a series of Ministerial *Izimbizo* with coastal communities along the west, south east and east coasts between June and November 2004 and after all registered industrial bodies and interest groups were consulted on sector management issues. On 1 March 2005, the Minister issued for public comment 19 draft fishery specific policies and a draft general policy on the allocation and management of long-term fishing rights.

A key feature of the draft policies was to divide the different commercial fisheries into four clusters. The clusters were determined having regard to the level of formal organisation within the various fisheries, the capital required for participation and the make-up of the participants in a fishery. A different allocation process (method of consultation, registration, distribution, receipting, communication and evaluation) was proposed for each cluster. The WCRL Offshore fishery was included in "*Cluster B*", along with other similarly organised, capital intensive fisheries such as hake long line, squid and tuna pole.

For purposes of public consultation, the notice and comment process set out in the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act 3 of 2000 and its regulations were adopted. The draft policies were published in isiXhosa, Afrikaans, isiZulu and English in the Government Gazette and on the Department's website and copies were distributed along the coastline.

During March 2005, the Department consulted with fishing communities along the coast. A total of 53 villages, towns and cities were visited and more than 6000 fishers were consulted. In April 2005, further consultations with communities took place in 16 venues along the coast about the draft traditional line fish policy. At each consultation, every comment was recorded and documented by the Rights Verification Unit ("RVU"), an independent team of auditors. At the end of the consultation process, more than 9000 fishers between Port Nolloth and Durban had been heard orally. Apart from the thousands of oral comments which were recorded, the Department also received more than 900 written comments on the policies. Significant changes were made to the policies after the comments were considered.

In May 2005, Cabinet approved the 19 "sector specific policies" and the "General policy". In July 2005, Cabinet also approved the traditional line fish sector policy.

Stakeholders and affected parties were also given the opportunity to comment on the application forms before they were adopted. An abbreviated notice and comment process was followed in Cluster B. Draft application forms for each fishery were published on the website and comments were invited. Numerous changes were made to the application forms after the comments were considered.

### **3. Appointing the Delegated Authority**

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In July 2005, and acting in terms of section 79 of the Marine Living Resources Act 18 of 1998 ("the MLRA"), the Minister appointed Dr A Cockcroft of the Department as the delegated authority responsible for the allocation of long term fishing rights in the WCRL Offshore fishery.

### **4. Registration, Distribution and Receipting of Applications**

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A detailed report entitled "*Registration, Distribution and Receipting in the Long-Term Rights Allocation Process*" will be made available on the Department's website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)).

The final deadline for registration for Cluster B sectors was set at 17h00 on Friday 25 July 2005 and for lodgement on either 5 September 2005 (between 08h00 and 19h00) or 6 September 2005 (between 08h00 and 17h00) at the Good Hope Centre in Cape Town. A total of 2179 applicants registered for Cluster B long-term commercial fishing rights. Of these, 1885 lodged their applications timeously.

The RVU receipted a total of 772 applications for long term commercial fishing rights in the WCRL sector on behalf of the Department. Of these:

- 234 claimed to be former full commercial medium term right holder applicants;
- 46 claimed to former limited commercial medium term right holder applicants; and
- 498 stated that they were new entrant applicants.

## 5. An interactive Application Process

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In the Cluster B sectors, applicants were able to communicate with the delegated authorities in the period between registration and closing day by e-mailing questions to a designated address. Queries and Responses (“Q & Rs”) were provided weekly by notices on the Department’s website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)) and by e-mail to each registered applicant. A report entitled “*The Interactive Application Process for the Allocation of Long-Term Rights Process*” will be made available on the Department’s website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)). All the Queries and Responses dealt with in Cluster B will be published as part of this report.

The delegated authority further communicated in Cluster B through website notices and updates and by way of “*FishRights*” – a fortnightly E-Newsletter that is placed on the Department’s website every second Monday. This newsletter is also e-mailed to over 400 fishing companies, journalists and circulated through interest groups and industrial bodies recognised by the Minister in terms of section 8 of the MLRA.

## 6. Decision making process

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The delegated authority was assisted by an Advisory Committee; legal advisors; the RVU and auditors; IT specialists; communication consultants; and administrative and project management specialists.

A report entitled “*The Decision-making Processes for the Allocation of Long-Term Rights*” will be made available on the Department’s website ([www.mcm-deat.gov.za](http://www.mcm-deat.gov.za)). In short, the process of allocating commercial fishing rights in the WCRL Offshore sector involved the following steps:

☞ *Database Development:* After the applications were receipted by the RVU, the delegated authority instructed the IT advisers to design a database to facilitate the analysis of applicant data across a range of fields, including, transformation, investment, job creation, compliance, and issues such as safety and catch utilisation. The main purpose of the database was to assist with the development of detailed criteria and weightings and for identifying internal inconsistencies and deviations that required special verification and consideration.

☞ *Criteria and weighting design:* After the database for the fishery had been constructed, the delegated authority, with the assistance of the Rights Allocation Unit, designed detailed criteria and weightings.

These criteria are listed below.

☞ Constitution of the Advisory Committees: The delegated authority constituted an advisory committee, which was chaired by a member of the Rights Allocation Unit. The advisory committee for the WCRL Offshore fishery consisted of –

☞ The role of the Advisory Committee in the WCRL Offshore fishery was to determine whether the applications were properly lodged, not materially defective and met the essential requirements of the fishery, to assess the information provided in each application, to comment, and in certain respects, to score the application in terms of the balancing criteria and weightings determined by the delegated authority.

☞ Instructing the Advisory Committees: Each advisory committee was briefed and instructed by the delegated authority, members of the Rights Allocation Unit and legal advisors on, *inter alia*, the following:

- The applicable statutory provisions and case law;
- The general policy and the sector specific policy adopted by the Minister and Cabinet for the WCRL Offshore fishery;
- The current biological, economic and transformation profiles of the fishery;
- The detailed criteria and weightings to be applied; and
- The purpose of each question asked in the application form applicable to the WCRL Offshore fishery.

☞ Guiding the Advisory Committees: Over the duration of the verification and scoring process, the delegated authority met with the chairperson and the members of the advisory committee to consider the approach to the assessment of information and the scoring of the applications.

☞ Decision-making: After all applications were evaluated, the chairperson of the advisory committee presented the results to the delegated authority. The delegated authority then considered each assessment form and score sheet individually, having regard to the application. If there was any uncertainty regarding the score or the assessment, the delegated authority discussed the matter with the relevant members of the advisory committee and satisfied himself that the assessment or score was correct. The delegated authority also considered whether the selected criteria and weightings achieved

the objectives set for the allocation of rights and adjusted the criteria and weightings in order to better achieve the objectives.

## **7. Sector Profile Prior to Long Term Rights Allocations**

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West coast rock lobster (*Jasus lalandii*) are slow-growing, long-lived animals. Female size at maturity varies and ranges from 57 millimetres carapace length (CL) to 66 millimetres CL. Male lobsters attain a larger size and grow faster than females. As a result of the size limit of 75 mm CL that is imposed on commercial fishers, male lobsters make up 90 to 99 percent of the catch.

West Coast rock lobster occur inside the 200m depth contour from just north of Walvis Bay in Namibia to East London. Commercial exploitation occurs from about 25°S in Namibia to Gansbaai on the Cape south coast. However, recreational fishing extends further eastwards to Mossel Bay.

The current harvestable biomass is estimated at around 8 percent of the pre-exploitation levels and spawning biomass at approximately 21 percent. This decline is largely a result of two effects: large unsustainable catches taken particularly during the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and a substantial reduction in the somatic growth rate during the 1990's.

Commercial fishing began in the 1880's. The commercial fishery expanded rapidly in the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Although catch records prior to 1940 are sparse, catches appear to have peaked in the period 1950 to 1965, when between 13 000 and 16 000 tons were landed annually.

Prior to 1946, the commercial fishery was unregulated. In that year, a tail-mass production quota was imposed to control exports. This formed the basis of the "output-controlled" management philosophy that is still employed in the management of the west coast rock lobster resource today.

From 1946 onwards, annual quotas were granted, based primarily on the performance of the fishery in the preceding season. Until the mid-1960's, catches were directly controlled by these quotas. In the 1967/68 fishing season, catch rates began to decline and quotas could not be filled. Decreases in the Total Allowable Catch ("TAC") to between 4 000 and 6 000 tons restored some balance in the period 1970/71 to 1989/90.

The tail-mass production quota was replaced by a whole lobster (landed mass) quota, and management by means of a TAC was introduced in the early 1980's. Area or zonal allocations were introduced at the same time. Other management measures that were enforced early on were size limits and a closed season. Catches of berried or soft-shelled lobsters were banned. The 1990/91 season again saw the catch rates drop and, in the ensuing years, the commercial TAC was gradually reduced, reaching 1 500 tons in the 1995/96 season. Since then, there has been a slow recovery, with the commercial TAC being set at 3 527 tons for the 2004/2005 season.

Prior to the introduction of lobster traps in the 1960's, the commercial fishery depended almost exclusively on hand-hauled, hoopnets, which are light and easy to deploy from small boats in shallow waters.

Hoopnets are seldom used at depths exceeding 30 metres. Hoopnet dinghies may either operate independently from the shore by means of an outboard motor or oars, or be transported to the fishing grounds by means of a motorized mother vessel (deckboat).

The west coast rock lobster fishery is made up of two distinct sectors: a commercial fishery and a recreational fishery. Recreational users may only fish using hoopnets from a boat or the shore, or practice breath-hold diving or poling from the shore. Recreational fishers may not sell their catch.

The WCRL (offshore) fishery is permitted to catch rock lobster in traps. In the medium-term rights allocation process, right-holders in this fishery were granted allocations of more than two tons each.

Right-holders in the WCRL (offshore) fishery use larger, more sophisticated vessels than right-holders in the WCRL (nearshore) fishery, which is restricted to using hoopnets in shallow water. The WCRL (offshore) fishery also employs larger numbers of crew.

The WCRL (nearshore) fishery replaced the subsistence fishery in 2001 in keeping with the recommendations of an independent review of subsistence fishing in South Africa. The review recommended that high-value subsistence fisheries such as west coast rock lobster, traditional linefish and abalone should be commercialised. The commercialisation of these fisheries has permitted fishers to sell and market their products.

Approximately 20 percent of the commercial west coast rock lobster TAC is allocated to the nearshore fishery and 80 percent to the offshore fishery. The reason for this split is that approximately 20 percent of the resource is located in the inshore region, while 80 percent is located offshore in deeper waters.

The offshore fishery supports some 5 500 employees, 95 percent of whom are black. Of these, more than 2 500 are sea-going personnel, with the remainder employed in processing and marketing operations on land. West coast rock lobster fishing takes place between November and July and the average annual income over this period is R26 500. The annual value of west coast rock lobster catches is approximately R200 million. The approximate value of vessels in this fishery is R130 million.

The west coast rock lobster fishery has been well managed and, since 1997, it has seen steady increases in the total allowable catch. In 2003, the Minister declared a total allowable catch for the commercial harvesting of rock lobster in the area east of Cape Hangklip. The Department continues to manage this fishery in terms of precautionary management principles.

## **8. WCRL Offshore Medium term rights**

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During the medium term rights allocation process, 234 full commercial west coast rock lobster fishing rights were allocated. An additional 511 limited commercial fishing rights were allocated, many to former subsistence fishers. Of the rights allocated in the full commercial fishery, 66 percent were granted to black persons and black-owned entities. The representation of blacks at senior management level in the full commercial fishery

is, however, only 34 percent. Of the rights allocated in the limited commercial fishery, 91.5 percent were allocated to black persons, predominantly to black-owned micro enterprises. .

In 2003, a further 230 tons of west coast rock lobster were allocated to 274 limited commercial right-holders in the area east of Cape Hangklip. Of the rights allocated, more than 90 percent were allocated to black persons.

In 1992, 39 predominantly white right-holders controlled the west coast rock lobster TAC. In contrast, by the end of 2003, 1 019 commercial rock lobster fishing rights had been allocated. Of these, many were allocated to former subsistence fishers. To accommodate the larger number of right-holders, the average allocation in 2002 was 6.8 tons, compared with an average allocation of 56 tons in 1992. In 1992, the highest allocation was 199 tons and in 2002, the highest allocation was 95.6 tons.

After the medium-term allocation process, 66 percent of right-holders in this fishery were black-owned. Thirty four percent were black-managed. These right-holders collectively controlled 60 percent of the TAC. Furthermore, small- and medium-sized enterprises made up 90 percent of right-holders.

## **9. Applicants for Long Term Rights**

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During the registration and distribution process and the interactive application process it was made clear that limited commercial right holders may apply in the form of a close corporation or company in the West Coast Rock Lobster Offshore sector and that they would be treated as a category of medium term right holders within the sector. Limited commercial right holders were informed that they could swap new entrant application forms for medium term right holder application forms. See, for example, the Q & Rs of 29 July 2005 and 5 August 2005.

Ultimately, a total of 772 applications were received for long term commercial rights in the WCRL Offshore fishery. As stated above, of these 280 were from medium term right holders (234 from WCRL Full Commercial medium term right holders and 46 from WCRL Limited Commercial medium term right holders) and 498 were new entrant applicants.

The applications were compared to each other in three categories: Former full commercial medium term right holder (“FC MTRH”) applicants, former limited commercial medium term right holder (“FL MTRH”) applicants and new entrant applicants (“NE”) applicants.

### **9.1 Application Form Database**

The data supplied by the applicants was loaded onto an IT application that made it possible to view summations of data and to sift and rank data. The data will be published as part of the report entitled “*The Decision-making Processes for the Allocation of Long-Term Rights*”.

The database provided the delegated authority and the Advisory Committee with the means to look at each applicant individually whilst also being able to have a “global” view of the entire sector instantaneously. This provided a huge gain on the 2001 allocation where far more reliance was placed on spreadsheet capturing of data and institutional memories.

The statistics provided a wider backdrop to sectoral fisheries than was extracted for purposes of analyses and ranking. This provided the delegated authority with the means to have a comprehensive insight into each fishery and thus the ability to make decisions on the basis of a context and relevant backdrop.

The statistics have provided data on each fishing sector that has never before been recorded and collated at such a detailed and comprehensive level. A detailed profile of each fisheries sector and indeed a profile of the entire commercial fishing industry can be written up for the first time ever. The data is presumed to be highly accurate as the applicants who supplied it would not want to risk or jeopardize their application by supplying inflated or misleading information. The data provides a tool for the management of fisheries beyond the round of current allocations.

Through the data accessed from the applicants it was possible, for the first time, to probe information or statements to a far higher degree. In this way, for example it was possible to probe the depth of and degree to which Black Economic Empowerment (“BEE”) was rooted in the industry at the end of 2005. In order to detect fronting or paper quotas it was possible to request information that would lead up to proof of BEE by:

- ❑ Testing the extent of black ownership of a company.
- ❑ Testing if dividends paid corresponded with the above ownership.
- ❑ Testing if voting rights corresponded accordingly.
- ❑ Testing if ownership had been paid for through company loans to BEE partners.
- ❑ Testing the extent to which black management is paid commensurate with white management.
- ❑ It was possible to test BEE in accordance with the 7 criteria contained in the Broad-based Black Economic Empowerment Act 53 of 2003.

On another level it was possible to ascertain performance by measuring the number of employees per ton of fish caught, the turnover per ton caught etc. If applicants had a joint venture agreement, for example, in the form of a vessel owning company, they could claim employees from the joint venture vehicle. It was possible to test whether such employees were properly “apportioned” and were not counted twice or thrice.

## **9.2 Profile of FC MTHR applicants**

A summary of some of the information submitted by the FC MTRH applicants in their application forms is set out directly below. It should be kept in mind that the information provided by applicants was assessed and in some instances claims made were rejected or corrected.

**(c) Financial information**

The mean annual turnover of the FC MTRH applicants was R 20,178,642.72, and the WCRL Offshore sector contributed 100% to the turnover of more than 75% of the applicants. The average rand value of turnover per ton allocated was R 82,635.44.

WCRL FC MTRH applicants made R 1,615,100,379.01 profit after tax, taking into account all the fishing sectors in which they participated. The FC MTRH applicants paid a total of R 937,857,704.56 in dividends in 2004. The combined asset value of the applicants across all sectors is R 15,124,929,657.99.

**(d) Transformation**

Out of the 234 applicants, 158 claimed that they fully achieved the goals set in the transformation plans submitted to the Department in 2001, whereas 32 claimed that they only partially met the goals, and 44 claimed that they did not meet the goals at all.

## **Ownership**

Black ownership of 76 applicants increased, 24 decreased and 134 remained the same. Only 7 applicants have employee share schemes, and on average these employees (other than top salary earners) own 15.69% of those 7 applicants.

R 111,478,170.16 was paid in dividends to black shareholders over the last year. Calculated on net asset value, the black shareholding in the applicants is worth R 488,104,339.83.

The FC MTRH applicants claimed that 41.59% of the employees in levels 5 – 10 are black.

### **Skills Development**

Of the 234 FC MTRH applicants, 52 submitted approved workplace skills plans and 49 submitted approved annual training reports. The applicants paid R 66,229,623.69 to SARS in skills development levies. The mean percentage of training budget spent on black employees was 47.03 %, amounting to a total of R 2,737,005.27. On average 18.79% of employees received learnerships.

### **CSI**

Of the 234 FC MTRH applicants, 40 made tax deductible donations and 92 made other forms of donations.

### **Affirmative Procurement**

The top ten suppliers of the applicants were, on average, 43.93% black and the applicants procured, on average, 51.78% of total expenditure from their top ten suppliers.

**(c) Financial information**

The mean annual turnover of the LC MTRH applicants was R 4,383,432.12, and on average the WCRL Offshore sector contributed 94.54% to the turnover of the applicants. The average rand value of turnover per ton allocated was R 88,863.51.

WCRL LC MTRH applicants made R 401,971.45 profit after tax, taking into account all the fishing sectors in which they participated. The LC MTRH applicants paid a total of R 724,166.57 in dividends in 2004.

**(d) Transformation**

Out of the 46 applicants, 14 claimed that they fully achieved the goals set in the transformation plans submitted to the Department in 2001, whereas 4 claimed that they only partially met the goals, and 28 claimed that they did not meet the goals at all.

**Ownership**

Black ownership of 2 applicants increased, 6 decreased and 38 remained the same. 17 applicants have employee share schemes, and on average these employees (other than top salary earners) own 43.44% of those 17 applicants.

### **Skills Development**

Of the 46 LC MTRH applicants, 2 submitted approved workplace skills plans and 1 submitted an approved annual training report. The applicants paid R 5,178.48 to SARS in skills development levies. The mean percentage of training budget spent on black employees was 18 %, and as very few applicants trained the mean amounted to a mere R 226. On average 26.89% of employees received learnerships.

## **CSI**

Of the 46 MTRH applicants, 4 made tax deductible donations and 19 made other forms of donations.

### **Affirmative Procurement**

The top ten suppliers of the applicants were, on average, 47.83% black and the applicants procured, on average, 47.04% of total expenditure from their top ten suppliers.

## **9.4 Profile of the NE applicants**

A summary of some of the information submitted by NE applicants in their application forms is set out directly below. It should be kept in mind that the information provided by applicants was assessed and in some instances claims were rejected or corrected.

### **(a) Investment**

The book value of total assets amounted to R 77,824,540.84 and the insured value to R 148,102,011.98 (for all fishing sectors). 104 out of the 498 NE applicants claimed that they invested in on-board or land-based processing.

### **(b) Job creation**

The NE applicants claimed to have an average of 12.84 employees at date of application in fishing sectors other than WCRL Offshore. They paid R 14,314,846.83 in salaries and dividends over the last year.

### **(c) Financial information**

The mean annual turnover of the NE applicants was R 1,088,366.83. Profit after tax for all the applicants together (in all sectors) amounted to R 1,582,065.70. The NE applicants paid a total of R 3,890,727.20 in dividends in 2004. The combined asset value of all the applicants (in all sectors) was R 142,077,443.02 in 2004.

## **10. Criteria**

### **10.1 Exclusionary Criteria**

All the applications were initially scrutinised to determine whether they were properly lodged, whether they were not materially defective and whether they fulfilled the essential requirements of the sector.

An application was ***improperly lodged*** if:

- ☞ the application was not lodged at the prescribed place within the prescribed time;
- ☞ the correct application fee was not paid within the required timeframes; or
- ☞ the application was not lodged on the official prescribed application form.

An application was ***materially defective*** if:

- ☞ the declaration was not signed and attested to by the authorised representative of the applicant, and if applicable, the authorised representative of the Holding Company, the Sister Company or the JV Partner(s);
- ☞ more than one application was received from the same applicant in the same sector;
- ☞ the applicant provided false information or false documents or the applicant failed to disclose material information, or

- ☞ the applicant attempted to influence the Minister or the delegated authority in a manner not provided for in the General policy during the application period.

An applicant failed to meet the **essential requirements** of the sector if:

- ☞ the applicant posed a paper quota risk as defined in the General policy;
- ☞ the applicant was a new entrant applicant and a medium-term right holder held shares in the applicant or used the applicant in order to proliferate in the sector in a manner contrary to the General Policy;
- ☞ the applicant is not a close corporation or company;
- ☞ the applicant breached a provision of the MLRA resulting in sanctions provided for in paragraph 8.1(b) of the WCRL Offshore sector policy;
- ☞ the applicant is not more than 50% South African owned;
- ☞ the applicant on average over or under caught by more than 30% during the medium term period; or
- ☞ the applicant has not demonstrated access to at least one suitable vessel. A suitable vessel for this fishery is a vessel that –
  - has a SAMSA registered length of not more than 30 metres and a minimum length of approximately 8 metres;
  - has a functioning vessel monitoring system;
  - is geared for either trap or hoop net fishing; and
  - does not operate in another fishery.

## 11. The decisions on the allocation of Rights

The delegated authority allocated WCRL Offshore commercial fishing rights to 170 of the 234 former full commercial medium term right holder applicants. These applicants were granted allocations ranging between 2 326 kilograms (the lowest) to 125 722 kilograms (the highest). The decisions in respect of one applicant

were reserved pending the finalisation of an investigation by the RVU. The remaining 63 applications from FC MTRH applicants were rejected.

The delegated authority allocated WCRL Offshore commercial fishing rights to 25 of the 46 former limited commercial medium term right holder applicants. These applicants were allocated 2000 kilograms each. The remaining 21 applications from LC MTRH applicants were rejected.

The delegated authority did not grant rights to any new entrant applicants.

The following lists are attached as annexure “A” to this GPR:

- “A.1”, the successful FC MTRH applicants in alphabetical order, together with their application numbers, vessel(s) authorised and quantum allocated.
- “A.2”, the successful LC MTRH applicants in alphabetical order, together with their application numbers, vessel(s) authorised and quantum allocated;
- “A.3”, the reserved applicant and its application number,
- “A.4”, the unsuccessful FC MTRH applicants in alphabetical order, together with their application numbers;
- “A.5”, the unsuccessful LC MTRH applicants in alphabetical order, together with their application numbers; and
- “A.6”, the successful NE applicants in alphabetical order, together with their application numbers.

## **12. The Allocation of Quantum**

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On 6 February 2006, the delegated authority issued a quantum allocation mechanism to the applicants in the WCRL Offshore fishery and called upon applicants to submit comments on the mechanism. After considering the comments, the delegated authority amended the mechanism. Ultimately the following mechanism was implemented (which must be read together with paragraph 8.3 of the WCRL Offshore sector policy):

### **WCRL OFFSHORE QUANTUM ALLOCATION MECHANISM**

#### ***Up front deductions for successful Migrants from the Limited Commercial Sector (“LC MTRHs”)***

1. *An amount of 2 tons (2000 kilograms) was subtracted from the 2005/2006 total allowable catch allocated to the WCRL Offshore sector (“2005/2006 TAC”) for each successful LC MTRH.*

#### ***Former full commercial medium term right holder applicants (“FC MTRHs”).***

2. *In respect of the FC MTRH applicants, the starting point was to allocate to each applicant the same portion of the 2005/2006 TAC (less proportional up-front deductions for successful migrants) as the portion they received of the 2004/2005 TAC.*

3. *The next step was to create the first redistribution pool amounting to a total of 5% of the 2005/2006 TAC of the FC MTRH group. This pool was created by subtracting a percentage amount from each successful FC MTRH's initial 2005/2006 allocation. The percentage subtracted differed and depended on the applicant's score. The higher the score, the smaller the percentage that was subtracted. This pool was redistributed to successful MTRH applicants ("the small achievers") that held less than twenty tons (20 000 kilograms) of the TAC, and scored above the 30<sup>th</sup> percentile for transformation and above the 30<sup>th</sup> percentile for the investment and job creation criteria.*

*The same amount was not redistributed to each small achiever. To qualify for the maximum possible allocation from this pool, a small achiever had to rank above the 70<sup>th</sup> percentile for transformation and above the 70<sup>th</sup> percentile for investment and job creation. Small achievers ranked between the 30<sup>th</sup> and 70<sup>th</sup> percentiles were allocated a proportion of the maximum allocation on a sliding scale, which was small if one or both scores were only slightly greater than the 30<sup>th</sup> percentile in question, and increased towards 100% as both scores approached the 70<sup>th</sup> percentiles.*

4. *The second allocation pool was created by deducting an amount of 1.5 tons (1500 kilograms) from each successful FC MTRH allocation, after the redistribution in terms of the first pool. The allocations of the unsuccessful FC MTRH applicants, as well as the allocations of MTRHs that did not apply for long term commercial rights were added to the second pool. The total was re-allocated in accordance with each successful applicant's total score, such that higher scoring applicants receive larger amounts. To increase the differences in amounts received by high and low scoring applicants, the scoring was geared so that higher scoring applicants received more in proportion to their scores, and lower scoring applicants received less.*

### **Appeals**

5. *No set amount (fixed percentage of the TAC or fixed tonnage) will be reserved for the reserved decision, appeals or reviews, but each successful applicant is allocated its percentage of the TAC plus/minus its share of gains or losses after the reserved decisions and the appeals and reviews instituted within 180 days after the conclusion of appeals, have been decided. In essence, the mechanism described above will be applied again after the reserved application has been decided, in the appeals process, or after a successful review, in order to determine whether a right holder (regardless of whether a right holder has appealed or not) should gain or lose quantum in terms of the mechanism. The amounts allocated to the successful migrants from the limited commercial sector may also be re-considered and changed, regardless of whether they have appealed.*
6. *This means that successful applicants will not be allocated a fixed percentage of the TAC for the first fishing season. The final percentage will become fixed only after the appeals, reviews (if any are instituted within 180 days after appeals) and the reserved decision has been decided. A provisional permit for a lesser amount will be allocated for the first part of the 2006 fishing season.*

The application of the quantum model to the medium term right holder applicants is annexed, in spreadsheet form as Annexure "B".

## **13. Policy reasons for the decisions on rights and quantum**

The reasons for excluding the applications that were materially defective or failed to meet the essential requirements for participating in the fishery have been dealt with in the General policy and the WCRL sector policy and will not be repeated here.

As far as the decisions on the applications in terms of the comparative balancing criteria is concerned, the delegated authority decided to allocate commercial rights to all the FC MTRH applicants that scored 40

points or more and to all the LC MTRH applicants that scored 35 points and more, in terms of the criteria and weightings set out above. This decision was informed by the following considerations:

- 13.1 The reason for the different cut-offs was that the LC MTRH applicants received significantly lower amounts over the medium term rights allocation period than the FC MTRH applicants. Although applicants from the two groups were not directly compared to each other, the relatively lower amounts allocated to the LC MTRHs made it more difficult for them to score points in terms of certain of the criteria, such as the creation of permanent jobs, investment in assets, processing and marketing, skills development, tax deductible corporate social investment and enterprise development. It was accordingly decided to lower the cut-off in respect of LC MTRHs to 35 points.
- 13.2 It will be noted that a few of the successful MTRHs applicants did not score well in respect of job creation and investment. The delegated authority carefully considered these applications and satisfied himself that they did not present a paper quota risk. The main reason why these applicants scored low was that their claims in respect of investment and job creation were not recognised. The claims were primarily rejected because the applicants did not properly apportion investment and jobs between sectors or between joint venture partners, as all applicants were required to do in the Explanatory Notes to the application form, if they chose to apply in the form of an economic unit. In many instances, if there was a failure to properly apportion, the delegated authority had no choice but to assess the applicant's jobs or investment at zero. The delegated authority is nevertheless satisfied that these applicants do not pose a paper quota risk.
- 13.3 The delegated authority decided that the applications from MTRH applicants that scored below the cut-offs of 40 and 35 points were too weak, particularly in respect of key criteria such as transformation or job creation and investment (or both), to justify the allocation of a right. Some of these applicants were victims of the same shortcoming discussed above (i.e. a failure to properly apportion jobs and investment between members of the economic unit) or they failed to properly merge transformation data with other members of the economic unit. These applicants may be able to rectify these shortcomings on appeal. Others, however, showed little regard for the imperative to transform and to become fully involved in the sector by investing or by creating jobs. The delegated authority took the view that MTRHs applicants had sufficient opportunities to do so over the medium term period and that it was necessary to exclude this group from further participation.
- 13.4 Out of the 205 successful applicants, 173 or more than 84% is black controlled. This is significantly more than the 66% of FC MTRHs that were black controlled.

13.5 One of the over-arching sectoral objectives was to improve certain aspects of the transformation profile of the fishery, such as the management of right holders. According to the medium term rights allocation process, 34% of right holders were black managed. In the long term rights allocation process, 50.65% of the successful applicants' top salary earners were, on average, black persons.

The delegated authority decided not to allocate WCRL Offshore commercial fishing rights to any new entrants. The reasons for this decision are as follows:

13.6 The WCRL Offshore sector policy provides that the fishery is optimally exploited and that there is no room for additional participants. It is further stated that new entrant applicants may be preferred over existing right-holders who have, amongst others, failed to transform, or who have failed to perform or who did not utilise their rights, or did not utilise them effectively.

13.7 The delegated authority rejected a significant number of applications from FC MTRHs applicants (63, in total), but he realises that some of these may be successful on appeal, if they can resolve the anomalies in their applications regarding the apportionment of jobs and investments and the merging of transformation data. The delegated authority further took into account that decisions on the application of a FC MTRH applicant with a relatively large quota has been reserved, pending the outcome of an investigation by the RVU. Further uncertainty is created by the fact that a number of former limited commercial medium term right holders applied as new entrants in the Offshore fishery. They may elect to be considered as a category of medium term right holders on appeal.

13.8 In the circumstances, the delegated authority decided that the best course of action, at this stage, is to replace the rejected FC MTRH applicants with a limited number of LC MTRH applicants, rather than to allocate rights to new entrants. It was felt that the MTRH applicants that proved themselves in the limited commercial sector over the medium term period should be preferred over applicants that have never participated in the harvesting of WCRL.

As far as the allocation of quantum is concerned, the delegated authority's decisions are informed by the following considerations:

13.9 The successful LC MTRH applicants were allocated an amount of 2 000 kilograms each. As these applicants participated in the limited commercial fishery during the medium term period, it was inappropriate to distinguish between them or to directly compare them to the FC MTRH applications.

Moreover, some of the successful MTRH applicants had amounts of 550 or 800 kilograms during the medium term period and it would have been unfair to use these amounts as the starting point and then to apply the pools system of redistributing quantum to them.

- 13.10 As far as the FC MTRH applicants are concerned, the delegated authority decided to redistribute 5% of the 2005/2006 TAC in terms of the first pool, which was directly aimed at rewarding small achievers. However, the small achievers also benefited significantly from the re-allocation in terms of the second pool, bringing their total gains to 15.1% of the TAC. This was considered to be more than sufficient to meet the policy objective of rewarding small achievers.
- 13.11 The delegated authority further increased the number of small achievers by lowering the thresholds for participating in the first pool to the 30<sup>th</sup> percentile for transformation and the 30<sup>th</sup> percentile for the investment and job creation criteria.
- 13.12 Higher thresholds, especially if combined with an increase of above 5% of the TAC allocated to the first pool, could lead to a situation where a small number of applications were granted increases that they were not able to effectively utilise over the long term period.
- 13.13 The transformation profile of the fishery has also been improved with the redistribution of quantum. During the medium term rights allocation process, 60% of the TAC was allocated to black controlled entities. This is now 61.07%. More importantly, the application of the quantum allocation mechanism resulted in a black ownership of 64.7% of the TAC.

## **14. Permit Conditions for this Fishery**

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The WCRL Offshore fishery policy stipulates that the permit conditions in this fishery will be determined after consultation with right holders and it will be subject to revision as and when it may be necessary.

The Chief Director: Resource Management (“the CD:RM”) is authorised to determine permit conditions in terms of section 13 of the MLRA. In order to sustainably manage this fishery, maintain the transformation profile of the fishery and to support the consolidation of the number of right holders that operate as joint venture entities, the CD: RM, after consultation with the delegated authority, and having regard to the policy objectives of this fishery intends to determine permit conditions that give effect to, *inter alia*, the following:

- 14.1 Performance Measuring:** Right holders in this fishery will be measured against criteria such as transformation, investment and compliance. The CD:RM will design permit conditions to ensure

adherence with these criteria and will require right holders to provide data during the second fishing season in this regard. Failure to reasonably comply with these permit conditions may result in the commencement of proceedings under section 28 of the Act.

**14.2 Reporting:** All right-holders in this fishery will have to adhere to strict reporting measures to ensure that the Department is provided with up-to-date correct catch data to ensure effective management of the fishery.
